NARROWS BRIDGE:

Take I-278 E / Gowarus Expressway to the 38th Street exit. At bottom of ramp, proceed straight one block to 5th Avenue, Turn left at 5th Avenue and continue 13 blocks to 25th Street. Cemetery entrance is on right.

PROMIEK AIRPORTS

Founded in 1838 as one of America's first rural cometeries, The Green-Wood Cemetery soon developed an The Green-Wood Cemeters soon developed an international reputation for ismagnificant beauty and became the fixthonalse place to be buried. By 1860, Green-Wood was attracting 500,000 visitors a year, rivaling Niagara Halls as the country's greatest rourist attraction. Crowde flocked to Green-Wood to enjoy family ourings, carriage rides and to Creen vision to enjoy family outrings, carriage notes and scalpiente visioning in the finest of first generation American landscapes. Circen-Wood's, popularity helped impire the creation of public parks, including New York City's Central and Prospect Parks.


Tislay Green-Wood is 473 spectacular acres of hills, A valleys, glacial pends and winding parts, throughout which exists one of the largest outdoor collections of 19th and 20th-century statuary and mausoleums.
