
From 2013-2015, about 207 programs

MIDDLE SCHOOL

STRETCH AND GAIN

Project PLANTS

Grant funded, 3 year program

Each year's cohort started with a week long summer camp and continued with meetings during the school year

Goal: show a variety of career options in horticulture and agriculture



What did you think when you first heard about an agriculture/horticulture camp?

Student 1: I thought it was lame.

Student 2: Uh yeh I thought it was lame.

Student 3: I thought it was lame too!

Moderator: You thought it was lame?!
